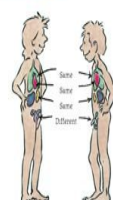
2 Making Babies Sexual Reproduction

The dictionary tells us more about sex. It says:

Sexual reproduction: Sex is also about reproduction—making babies. To reproduce means to "produce again," or "make again."

Certain parts of our bodies make it possible for a male and a female, when their bodies have grown up, to reproduce—to make babies. The parts of our bodies that make this possible are called the reproductive organs.

Our bodies' organs are the parts of our bodies that have special jobs to perform. For example, the heart is the organ whose special job is to pump blood. Scientists know that most organs inside our bodies, such as our heart, our lungs, and our stomachs, are the same whether we are male or female. One group of organs that is not the



same for a female and a male is the reproductive organs. People also call the reproductive organs the sexual organs or the sex organs. The female and male sex organs are designed to work in an amazingly interesting way. They are different from each other because they have different jobs to do.
