tector "spent too much time on minutiae" (p. 99), that the Major-Generals "largely superseded the justices of the peace" (p. 169), and that the sixty members for Scotland and Ireland in the 1656 Parliament "were virtually handpicked by the Government" (p. 169). It is misleading to say that the republicans were responsible for overthrowing the Protectorate "after Oliver's death" (p. 172), and many historians will not accept his estimate that the Levellers had only "a few thousand of followers" (p. 206). Ashley gives a vigorous defense of the traditional view that the Arminianism of Charles and Laud was ceremonial rather than theological, and it may well turn out that the recent success of Nicholas Tyacke's contrary view will not be permanent.

This reminds us that any book by Maurice Ashley has some merit. Most of his judgments on Charles and Cromwell are even-handed, subtly favoring the Lord Protector. Instead of criticizing what may be his worst book, perhaps we should merely rejoice that he has contributed so much to Cromwellian studies for over fifty years.

Michael Hunter and Annabel Gregory, editors. *An Astrological Diary of the Seventeenth Century: Samuel Jeake of Rye, 1652-1699*. New York: The Clarendon Press, Oxford University Press. 1988. Pp. xiii, 297. \$78.00.

This very useful edition of a previously unpublished later seventeenth-century diary is a welcome addition to the body of works in this genre in the period. It will, without a doubt, provide an important source for social, intellectual, and religious historians as well as for historians of science and astrology. Fresh insights into the changing intellectual temper of the time may be gained by studying this individual's presentation of his own private world which illuminates our understanding of contemporary assumptions and belief systems. The diary has intrinsic interest, too, for the general reader in that it presents an invaluable view of daily life in a provincial town and of familial and business relationships within it.

The book contains some 165 pages of clearly presented diary text with a minimum of distracting footnotes. It contains a glossary of astrological and other obsolete terms and symbols, useful not only for readers of the text but for students of astrology in the seventeenth century in general. Inclusion of other related diary texts, a biographical guide to the *dramatis personae* included in the record, as well as a full index makes for easy comprehension of an otherwise occasionally obscure source.

A long introduction places the diary into a number of illuminating contexts which map out the historical terrain within which the text should be located. At the same time it discusses in detail the motives and purposes of diary-keeping in general and of Jeake's effort in particular. Jeake stated clearly what he saw as the overall aim of his diary on his title page: "A Diary of the Actions and Accidents of my Life: tending partly to observe and memorize the Providences therein manifested; and partly to investigate the Measure of Time in Astrological Directions, and to determine the Astrall Causes etc. Rye, begun July 12, 1694" (p. 83). It is therefore a peculiar diary. It is carefully put together, purposefully collecting information about his own life from a number of sources—most of which have not survived and completing the whole within
